

The next topic for the night was Editing/Assembling Panoramic photos. It included a demonstration by Jean Davids and an opportunity to ask questions. Jean Davids two videos on the editing process and then proceeded to do a demo of them on her laptop. This way people could ask questions if wanted. The first video was How to Make a Panorama in Lightroom. It was put on by Aaron Nace at PHLEARN. The second video was also by Aaron Nace at PHLEARN on How to Make a Panorama in Photoshop. "We have already received inquiries from a number of camera clubs interested in taking advantage of this opportunity. To help us coordinate presentations for as many camera clubs as possible, I would appreciate if you could provide the following details:

- 1. The number of members in your camera club, and how many you think might be interested in viewing a live online presentation by Tim Grey.
- 2. Information about the preferred date and time for a presentation for your group. For example, many camera clubs prefer to schedule this type of online presentation based on when the group would normally be meeting in person.
- 3. Whether your camera club would be most interested in a presentation on Adobe Lightroom Classic, Adobe Photoshop, or photography, based on the interests of your specific group.

We would be able to manage the logistics for registration and the presentation on our end, so all you would need to do is promote the online presentation to your camera club (and other nearby camera clubs if you'd like as well). We can have hundreds of photographers join the live online presentation, so we would encourage you to promote the event widely. The normal duration for the presentation is 45 minutes, followed by a question and answer period of about 15 minutes.

We can also record the session, so anyone who registers will have access to the recording (even if they aren't able to attend the live online presentation)."

The meeting adjourned around 8:30 pm.
