

Members had been encouraged to bring in their camera and a tripod (if desired) to try their hands on shooting Bokeh shots. Jean provided a backdrop with Christmas lights on it and also brought in some small items to use as subjects. Examples were a bear taking a photo, an eagle, some Peanuts characters, an angel and others. Some others brought in items that they wanted to try.
